Awards: The Farberow Award

The Farberow Award was introduced in 1997 in recognition of Professor Norman Farberow, a founding member and driving force behind the IASP. This award is for a person who has contributed significantly in the field of work with survivors of suicide, and nominations can be made by any member of IASP.

Members of the International Association for Suicide Prevention (IASP) are invited to nominate suitable persons for the Farberow Award. It is for the person who in the view of the award committee has contributed significantly in the field of work with survivors of suicide. Nominees do not necessarily have to be IASP members.

The criteria for selection are:

- has been actively involved in the establishment and operation of bereaved through suicide/survivor programs.
- has demonstrated national leadership in the area.
- has contributed to the research and evaluation of such programs.
- will continue to involve themselves in this important area of work.
